



GARRETT COUNTY COVID-19 BUSINESS ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM (formerly known as the Garrett County Kick-Start Grant Program)

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AND GRANT APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Home-based businesses, churches or religious institutions, banks and financial institutions, investment/real-estate entities, government agencies, and independent contractors **ARE NOT** eligible to apply.

Businesses that are/were awarded a Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) Grant **ARE NOT** eligible to apply.

Businesses that have been open for less than one year **MAY BE** eligible for a lesser grant amount.

Grants will be on a first-come, first-serve basis until the pool of funds has been depleted.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible for the grant of a maximum of \$2,500, the applicant business must:

- Be native to, and physically located within, Garrett County;
- Be solvent and plan to reopen for business once Governor Hogan’s Executive Orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic are lifted;
- Be a business in good standing with the Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation;
- Be a “for profit” restaurant or other food service business of any size **OR** a “for profit” small business with up to 25 employees **OR** a self-employed individual who does not fall into one of the excluded categories listed above;
- Have been forced to reduce business services or operations, or had to close, due to Governor Hogan’s Executive Orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic; **AND**
- Prove significant loss of revenue due to Governor Hogan’s Executive Orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

To apply, a business owner must provide the following:
